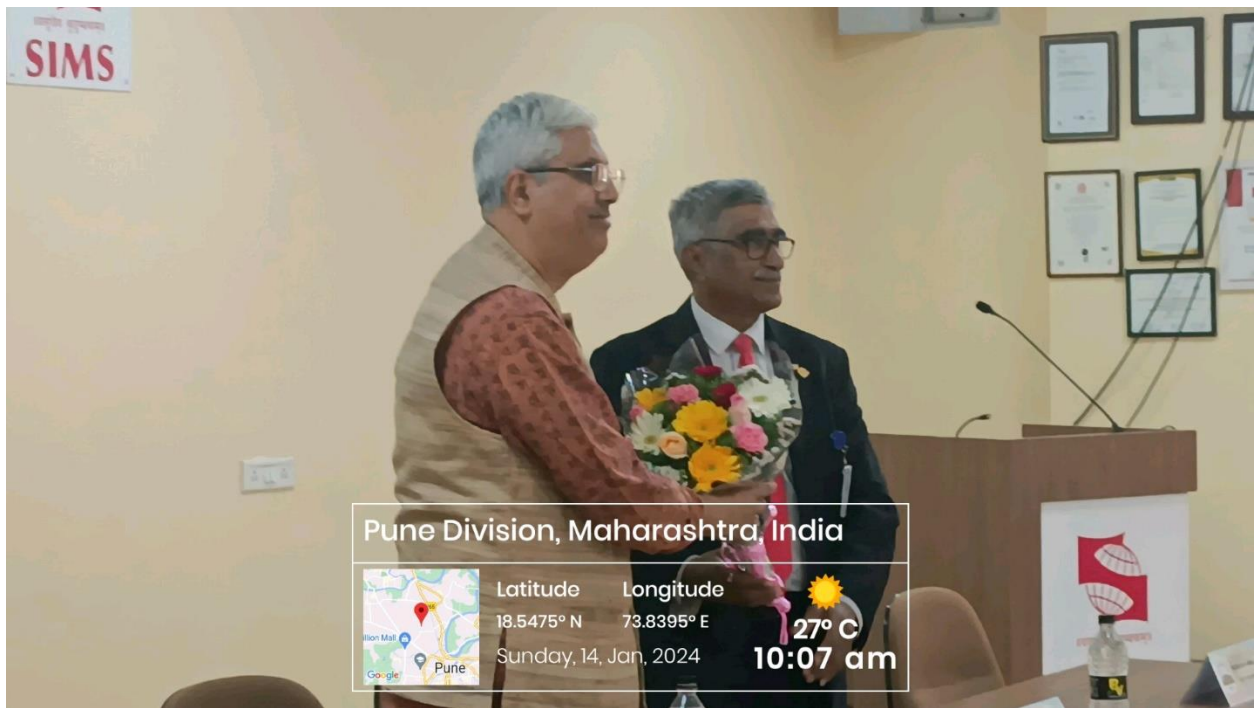

His insightful address was followed by an enthusiastic Q&A session. The delegates and EB’s went to their respective committee rooms as the event began in its earnest.





Lok Sabha Report

SIMS Youth Parliament 2024

The Lok Sabha sessions unfolded with an intense focus on the colonial-era sedition law and its implications for contemporary Indian democracy. Originally crafted to stifle dissent during British rule, the law underwent a rigorous analysis to assess its relevance and applicability in present-day India. Members of Parliament from various political parties engaged in a thorough examination of the law, engaging in debates regarding its necessity and the potential for misuse.

Proponents of the sedition law argued vehemently for its retention, asserting that it played a pivotal role in upholding national sovereignty and maintaining public order. They viewed the law as an indispensable tool to protect the state from anti-national elements and ensure political stability. However, critics of the law emphasized its susceptibility to abuse, contending that it could be wielded as a mechanism to suppress free speech and dissent—crucial components of a thriving democracy. The irony was underscored as a democratic nation grappled with the paradox of employing a colonial-era law to curtail the very freedoms its founding leaders fought to establish.

Within the hallowed halls of the Lok Sabha, the discussions on the sedition law reached a consensus acknowledging the imperative for its cautious application. Members of Parliament collectively recognized the need to prevent it from devolving into a tool for political vendettas or the unwarranted suppression of legitimate dissent. They affirmed that, while national security and sovereignty were undeniably paramount, these considerations should not come at the expense of fundamental democratic principles. This nuanced and comprehensive deliberation within the Lok Sabha marked a significant step towards balancing the imperative of national security with the preservation of the democratic ethos that defines the soul of the nation.

Central to their arguments was the assertion that denying fundamental rights, such as inheritance, adoption, and family unit recognition, to same-sex couples amounted to blatant discrimination. They passionately emphasized the need for societal acceptance and legal acknowledgment of same-sex relationships, contending that such recognition was essential for fostering an inclusive and equitable society.

Contrastingly, the BJP positioned itself as a staunch opponent of the legalization, rooted in the preservation of cultural values and societal norms. Their argument centered on the belief that same-sex marriage was incompatible with the traditional structure of Indian families and could potentially lead to social disruption. However, this stance faced criticism for lacking empirical data and scientific rationale, with detractors contending that cultural values, while important, should not hinder progress towards a more inclusive society.

As the debate unfolded, the clash between cultural preservation and the pursuit of equality became increasingly apparent. Advocates for legalization urged lawmakers to move beyond traditional norms, emphasizing that societal progress demanded recognition and protection of the rights of all citizens, irrespective of their sexual orientation. The outcome of this impassioned debate carried significant implications for the future direction of India's legal and societal landscape.

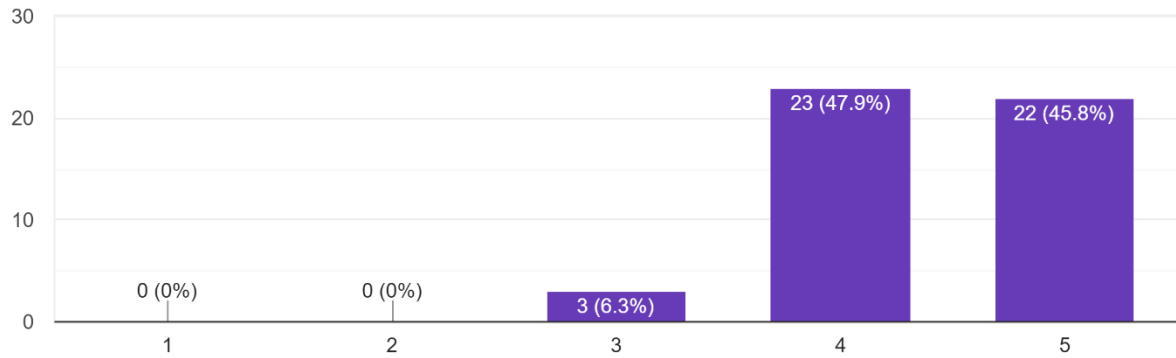

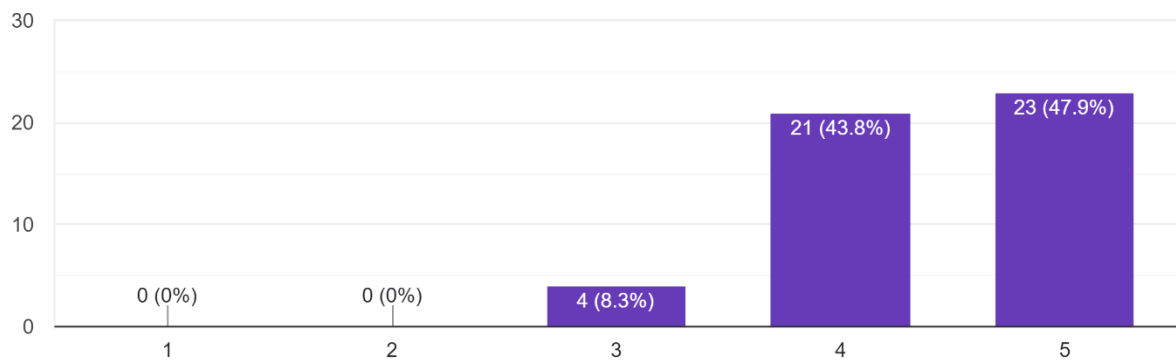

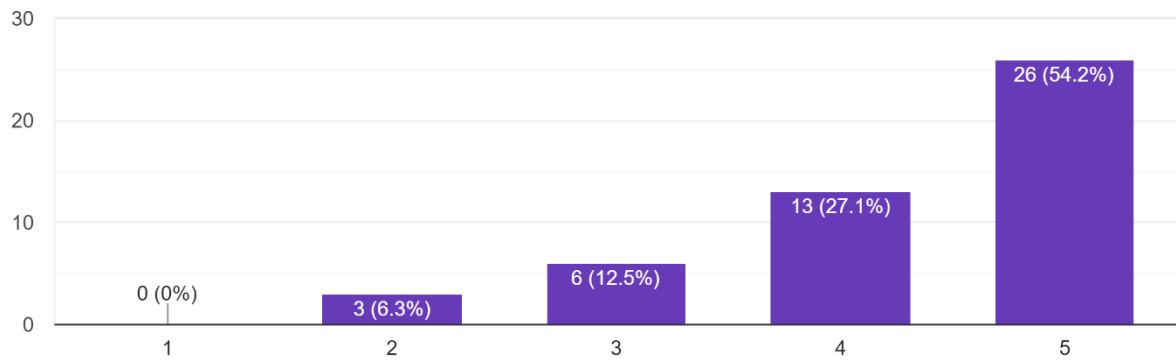
How would you rate the conduct of the Organisation committee?

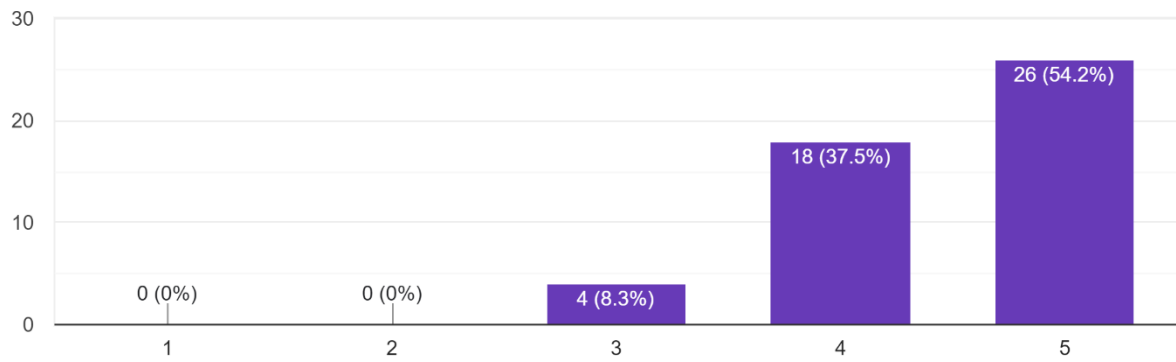

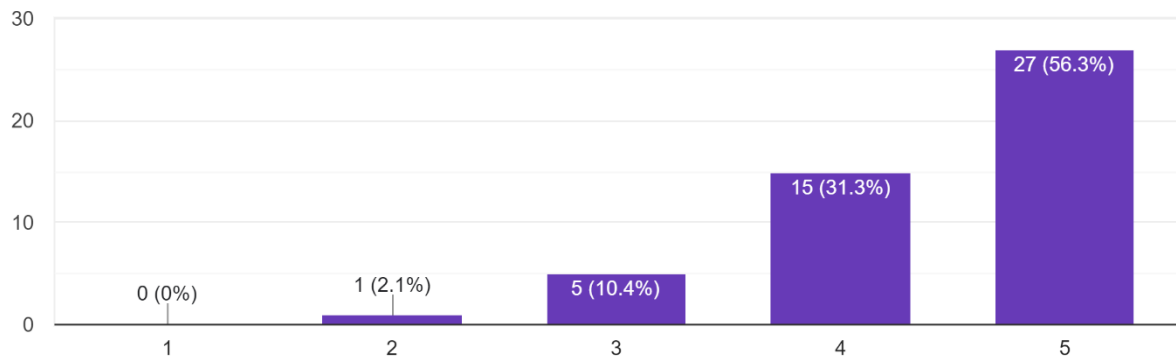

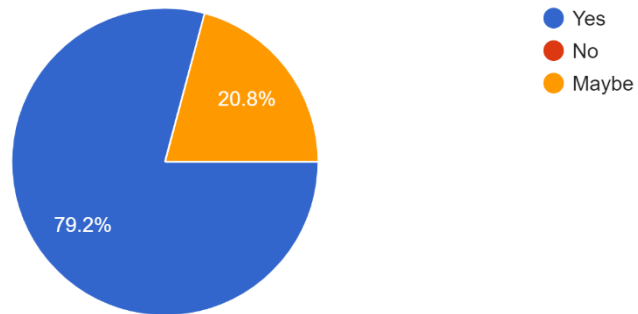
